

Gene Douglas, Candidate for U.S. Congress

I was born and raised in Philadelphia. My mother was an elementary school teacher; my father worked for DuPont and later became a College Instructor\Administrator in Engineering. I attended The King's College in Briarcliff Manor, NY majoring in Chemistry and Math. During the summers I was a member of the Teamsters Union as a Cab Driver in Philadelphia. I graduated in 1979, then went on to graduate school in Chemistry, first to ND

State University, then to the University of Connecticut in Storrs, where I earned my MS degree in 1982 in Polymer Science Chemistry. In 2010, I completed my PhD in Fiber/Polymer Science at NCSU.

After my first MS degree, I worked for a few years in industry as a chemist, before returning to school for a theological degree. I received my M.Div. from Bethel Theological Seminary in San Diego, CA in 1989. We moved to Hawaii in 1997, after finishing a two-year teaching contract at the College of Micronesia - FSM, in the Federated States of Micronesia, on the island of Pohnpei. I have taught Chemistry in Hawaii, New Hampshire, Pennsylvania, North Carolina, Kazakhstan, Iraq, South Texas, South Carolina, and now I am a retired Chemistry and Education consultant.

In 1998 I ran for the US Senate, placing third in a field of nine for the Republican nomination. I served as Campaign Director for my wife Carol, who went on to win the Republican primary and ran in the General Election as the Republican Nominee for US House District 2 for Hawaii. We then did the same in 2000, also in Hawaii, me coming in 2nd out of 4 candidates, and my wife coming in second to the winner of the primary. After moving to New Hampshire, I decided to run for the US House against a liberal Republican, Rep. Charlie Bass, the congressman at the time who did not support President Bush's efforts on ending partial birth abortion. He won the primary, and then I endorsed him for his later win against Katrina Swett, to retain the House seat for the Republican party. After this, I withdrew essentially as a candidate, concentrating on my college teaching.

When I retired I sold my house in Robeson County and moved to Wake County. I soon realized my district has a liberal feminist representing all of us! And after seeing the great movie, Sound of Freedom, at the theater, I took up the challenge and decided to try to remove her from Congress in 2024.

I believe in . . .

- Lower taxes—simplifying the tax code, a lower flat rate with minimal deductions for individuals and businesses.
- Smaller government, less government regulations, sending more power back to the states.
- Local control of education to be more responsive to the needs of our children; end DEI and Woke nonsense.
- Protection of innocent human life from conception until natural death.
